Evaluation and Recommendation

<u>Challenges faced – staff workshops</u>

1) Timing

 rather difficult to organize workshops around school calendar; many teachers who indicated interest were unable to attend because of timing

2) Demanding

 Conducting in-house workshops are demanding as EL teachers are not trained to teach adults; EL teachers also have to put aside a lot of time to prepare and run these workshops

Evaluation and Recommendation

Challenges faced- student programmes

- 1) Appeal
- Coming up with suitable school-wide games which appeal to students of all age groups

- 2) Coordination
- Organising level wide competitions requires much coordination and it is also quite difficult to find the assembly slots to run these competitions
