

## Objectives of the WSA-EC in XMPS

- Enhance English proficiency of teachers
- Raise pupils' English competency





## **Role of School Leaders**

- Spearheaded by the Principal
- Established communication platforms





#### Environment

- Culture of collegiality
  - Launch of the school as a professional learning community in 2010
- Generative conversation
- Provision of resources





## Leveraging Teachers' Competencies

- Measuring teachers' proficiency
  - English Proficiency Test conducted by the British Council
  - Courses tailored by the British Council to meet the needs of teachers
  - Written and spoken communication courses organised for the EAS and Allied Educators
  - Versant test (Pearson) carried out for all staff





# Leveraging Teachers' Competencies

- Customisation to further enhance teachers' proficiency:
  - School-level
    - Sharing of common English bloopers with teachers during Contact Time
    - 'Parking Lots' for queries with regards to English
    - Pre-assembly programmes
    - Speak Good English Movement (staff and pupils)
    - Annual Learning Fest@XMPS





# Engagement/ Involvement

- Department level
  - 6-year English communication programme
  - Reading coaches employed to support struggling readers (one-to-one coaching)









## Engagement/Involvement

- Department level
  - Critical areas adopted as focus for Academic Action Team (AAT) projects
  - Customised materials designed by teachers to meet our pupils' needs
  - Adopted <u>projects</u> like QAR and Reading for P1s from AAT projects

- Evidence of effective communicators




## Impact on Pupils

P5	85.7%	84.1%
P6 (PSLE)	99.0%	?
